


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

"The name of Mission Church of St. Paul" The Construction

WHY, WHEN AND WHERE ST. PAUL'S CHURCH "NOW AND THEN"

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

Greetings to you in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ.

First of all, I would like to Praise and Thank the Father Almighty for his blessings upon me and granting me an extension of life by 25 years from 1990 and has given me an opportunity to write the history of "the Mission Church of St. Paul" for publication in the SEPTA QUINTA QUINQUE CENTENNIAL SOUVENIR.

Our church located next to Bowring and Lady Curzon Hospital has a great and an interesting story behind it.

To begin with, I urge you to roll back your memories and recollect the fact that turn of the Eighteenth Century and the dawn of the Nineteenth Century was coloured by the British Imperialism and dominance in India. Please note that, I have not recorded the complete history of the Mysore Kingdom or the Fourth Anglo-Mysore War or the history of Karnataka, but have just pen- down a few glimpses of it that are linked with this venerable Church's History.

The onslaught of Tippu Sultan at the hands of the British in 1799 led to the culmination of the Fourth Anglo-Mysore War.

After the 'one day battle', the British set-up their military barracks at Seringapatam, which was the first capital of the erstwhile Mysore Kingdom. The region being flooded with war corpses led to the breeding of mosquitoes, subsequently resulting in the outbreak of a disastrous pestilence of Malaria, forcing the British to evacuate their Military base. On an agreement between the then Maharaja of Mysore and the Madras Government, it was decided to shift the military base from Seringapatam to Bangalore (Fort near City Market). The shifting of the capital from Mysore to Bangalore in 1831 was mostly due to its balmy climate and for a variety of tactical and official reasons.

At first the British troops were stationed in the Bangalore Fort (City Market area) but by 1807 the British felt the need to build new barracks in order to accommodate the increasing military garrison. In response to the request made by the British, the then Maharaja of Mysore

allotted a land spanning across Agaram and the adjoining area near Halasuru village (about 6 Kilometres east of Bangalore). The total area of the Cantonment covered an area over 13 square miles from the Residency in the west to Binnamangala in the east. The Tanneries in the North to Agaram in the south. This led to the birth of another region called 'Petah' (the areas beyond the city market) which was administered by the then Wadeyars of Mysore.

The British garrison, stationed in the Cantonment consisted of Artilleries, Batteries and regiments of the Cavalry, Infantry, Sappers and Miners, Supply and Transport Corps, Bangalore Riffle Volunteers (BRV) and other units. The headquarters of the BRV is a stone building located at the junction of the central street and Cubbon Road, which now serves as the Canteen Stores Department (CSD) for defence personnel. It is said that, the Bangalore Cantonment was the largest military base in south India.

The centre of the Bangalore Cantonment was the South Parade ground (now called Manekshaw Parade Ground on M.G Road).

The establishment of the Cantonment in Bangalore, provided enormous job opportunities. The fact of the reason was that, the areas such as Oossoor, Halasur, Binnamangala, Blackpally were part of the Cantonment and were under the administration purview of the Madras Presidency. Since the Cantonment was connected to Jolarpet (Madras) it brought in many migrants (mostly from Senji near Madras) and other nearby regions. One of the offshoots of this history, is that the Bangalore Cantonment Railway Station (located at Millers Road) was constructed by the British in those days is still serviceable. Today many trains pass through it and connect it to a large number of cities and states in India.

The migrants who settled in a particular area within the Cantonment cultivated white rice and hence the area came to be called "Billi Akki Palli" (the area of white rice cultivation). Another fact of history accounts, that the area in which the Indians (Blacks) resided was called by the Britishers as "Black Pally" (meaning the Residence of the Blacks).

Even to this day, the aged citizens living/ lived in the Black Pally still identify themselves as the residents of Black Pally and not by any current names (Tasker Town or Shivajinagar).

A large number of Indians who lived in the nearby areas like Benson Town, Williams Town, Fraser Town, Cox Town, Cleveland Town and other surroundings served the British officers and their families as cooks, butlers, drivers, launderers and even as sepoys in the British army.

Most of them spoke Tamil and many embraced Christianity.

Apart from administrative interests, the British set a mandate to worship God on Sundays and this became the ever reigning practice, wherever they ruled. And so, the Britishers travelled all the way from the Cantonment barracks to the Fort Church(Bangalore Fort near City Market) to conduct Divine worship services. There was only one Chaplain then to administer the service. Finding it tiresome of travelling a long distant from the Cantonment barracks to the Fort, the then Chaplain and the British officers plotted an area midway between the Cantonment and the Fort and thus St. Mark's Church was born in 1808 (now called St. Mark's Cathedral, No.1 M.G Road). St. Mark's Church, then was meant exclusively to cater the British Officers and their families. Many churches in those days were built by the Madras Government (then called the Madras Presidency).

Since, there were no churches built for the Tamil speaking natives, the then Chaplain, the members of St. Mark's Church in association with the S.P.G Mission Society felt the need to build a separate church for the Tamil speaking masses residing in the Black Pally and the adjoining areas.

Certain records of our church show that till recently not less than 200 families were residents of Black Pally and nearby areas.

It is said that the efforts were made in the year 1835, but it did not materialise. However, the place on which our church stands today was chosen by them in 1838. The record reads as follows:

"The first stone of the church was laid on the fifth day of August, 1839 and the building was completed within six months.

It was consecrated by His Lordship on the 31 March, 1840 with the name of "the Mission Church of St. Paul".

The act of the consecration particularly expresses that it is dedicated for Divine service in the native language only (i.e Tamil only).

The Tamil service was accordingly commenced on the Sunday following (5 April, 1840) and has been continued without interruption.

Morning prayers are said daily at half past seven, and there are full services with sermons on Sundays at half past 10 a.m and at half past 4 p.m also on Thursday evenings.

The church was visited by Mr. Trevor for the sacraments of Baptism or the Lord's Supper.

It is my greatest delight to mention here, that our church was the first Tamil High Anglican Church in the erstwhile Mysore kingdom (now called Karnataka).

At this juncture, I feel it is my bounden duty to mention the exemplary character of a Godly man by name Rev. George Trevor (S.P.G) who was instrumental in building our church by "opening a subscription in the year 1838 for a double purpose of maintaining schools and building a church".

The corresponding record throws light on the endeavour of Rev. G. Trevor:

"The total cost for the building of the church was Rs. 1250.14 (about 125 Pounds) and of a school room in the church yard was Rs. 89.8 of these sums Rs. 354 were still owing upon the day of consecration, but Mr. Trevor having made himself responsible for the debt (without which the consecration would have been delayed) the liberality of a friend, whose name was not mentioned, was stirred up to send him a donation of that amount the very next day".

Thanks to our Lord for the life and witness of Rev. Samuel William Coulthrop, who was ordained and licensed to the spiritual charge for the native congregation of Saint Paul's Church, Bangalore.

Here, I must pause to thank and praise Almighty God for the services of 28 Priests, Deacons and others ordained Priests, who had served in our church, and co-operated with the congregation and the members of the pastorate committees and honoured the decision in various respects of our fore-fathers, who dedicated this church for "Divine Service" in the "native language" only.

I am astonished to find inexplicable records maintained by the S.P.G Missionaries. I reproduce here below on the note of the number of the baptised persons in St. Paul's in those far offdays.

"On the opening of the church, the congregation was found to average about eighty on Sunday, and fifty at the weekday lecture, fully double what it was before, it has now increased to 150 ordinarily, and at Easter, Christmas and on other occasions, the church though designed for 200 (which was four times as many had previously been assembled) has been insufficient to contain the congregation. The total number of souls in the Mission (baptised persons) is about 333".

The above note precisely states that the church was designed for 200 and the same was insufficient to contain the congregation which was growing rapidly.

Due to the extension of the Cantonment, many Tamil Christians especially those who love the Anglican Tradition joined our church that necessitated extensions. Therefore, the church building was extended three times periodically.

The first was in 1901. A stone tablet fixed at the Baptistery (North-End) reads as follows:

The second was in 1936. A stone fixed on the Western façade of the church (Vestry) declares the following:

The third was in 1947. The foundation stone for the third extension of our church is found on the South-end. The tablet says the following:

It is to be appreciated and a mention must be made about our Mothers Union which played a prominent role in raising funds for this extension. A rectangular brass plate fixed beside the arch of the Sanctuary reads as follows:

THIS TABLET ERECTED IN APPRECIATION OF

THE LAUDABLE EFFORTS OF THE MOTHER'S UNION OF ST. PAUL'S CHURCH, BANGALORE IN RAISING FUNDS AND MEETING THE COST OF THE BUILDING THIS SANCTUARY WHEN THE CHURCH WAS EXTENDED.

In order to accommodate the ever increasing Tamil Christians from various distant parts and outskirts of the city, some temporary structures have been put-up in the recent past.

A portico adjoining the western façade of the church was constructed and dedicated on the 31.10.1993. A side portico on the North side was added in the year 2009.

If God willing, the church may be extended for about 20-25 feet (or as required)on the Eastern side (Altar).

Many of our members are unaware of the fact that our church parsonage, parish hall cum school were the absolute property of the S.P.G. In the year 1961, on 22 March the S.P.G transferred its property to the Church of South India Trust Association (C.S.I.T.A) in Madras.

The properties transferred are:

(a) The Church

St. Paul's Church, Hospital Road extent 24 cents, bounded on the North by Bowring Hospital, East by Parsonage, South by Hospital Road and the West by entrance to Bowring and Lady Curzon Hospital.

(b) The Parsonage

St, Paul's Parsonage, Old Poor House Road No. 449, bounded on the North by the Parish Hall. Cum. School East by Old Poor House Road, South by Hospital Road and West by St. Paul's Church.

(c) Parish Hall cum School

St. Paul's church parish hall.cum. School, no.449, old poor house road extent 143*49, Door No. 450 bounded on the North by Bowring Hospital quarters, East by Old poor House Road, South by St. Paul's Parsonage, West by Bowring Hospital Quarters.

A hundred and seventy five years is a long period but it looks as if the church was built just a few years back.

A hundred and seventy five years vanished, but the Red and White coloured Gothic styled Church has stood the test of time and stands majestically as a witness to the glorious past.

These days the church is kept open for people of all faiths. The church is a tower of hope, faith and deliverance. The church is a haven of solace and strength to all people, who rush to the church with tears and anxieties, to pray for the lives of their near and dear ones who are involved in severe accidents, suicide attempts, critical and complicated confinement case and the terminally ill patients admitted in the Bowring Hospital.

The history and truth mentioned above Was and Is possible because of two reasons:

- (a) God with us
- (b) It is also because of God fearing and dedicated Men and Women, who stood strong and firm withstanding every storm and wave, enduring every pain and anxiety and continued their membership ever praying and ever supporting the church and its Mission for the past 175 years.

Some have served on various committees. Many have liberally and whole heartedly donated for various programmes, renovation of the church, parsonage, parish hall and also to build the extensions and the additional structures.

Some have donated for the music systems, vestments, sacramental elements, altar needs, office needs, furnitures, TV's, electronic goods and for so many other church needs, sunday school and VBS, etc. The list goes on and on and never ceases.

I am thankful to every one for the contributions, donations, offerings with which the church is maintained to its present status for the Glory of God and for the service of H_{is} People. Let us therefore enter this holy and blessed church thankfully and -

From Across Secretary's Table

My dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

"Greetings to you in the precious name of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ."

In the year 1990, our church celebrated its Sesquicentennial Year anniversary (150 years). The then Pastorate Committee released a Souvenir during which period, I had the blessed opportunity to present the Secretary's Report titled "From across the Secretary's Table".



Our then Presbyter-in-Charge Rev. J. Saduri and the Pastorate Committee members were: Mr. Ravi Premkanth (Treasurer), Mr. V. Arputharaj, Mr. Charles Wesley, Mr. Edwin Joshua, Mr. G. M. Dhanraj, Mr. J. David, Mr. Jacob Daniel, Mr. I.B. Prabhakar, Mr. Solomon Manoraj, Mr. J. Wilson, Mrs. Jem Deva Bala Victor and Mrs. Joyce Zachariah.

I am delighted to present once again the secretary's report with the same title for publishing in the Septaquintaquinque Centennial year Souvenir.

I have no words to praise and thank Almighty God, the Father of all things for the abundant grace and blessing for the enormous gift of life by 25 years (from 1990) and led me to cross half and a quarter century this year (2015).

I confess that, I did nothing extraordinary in our church during the past 30-35 years holding office in various capacities as a Secretary, Treasurer and a Pastorate Committee Member to deserve and receive God's blessing to serve as the Secretary during the Sesquicentennial celebrations in 1990 and now when the church is commemorating its Septaquintaquinque centennial anniversary.

But then, here I am occupying the Secretary's office with fear and confusion as to what to report and what not to report because, I have witnessed and participated in various activities and programs for over 3 decades in general and the last 12 months in particular. However, I had to write my report and just as I sat with prayers for wisdom, knowledge and memory power to recollect the happenings and events during the Sesquicentennial year celebrations, it flashed to me that on 30.03.1989 the P.C Members were preparing to fix a stone tablet (presented by Uncle Paul Premkanth and Family) to mark the beginning of the 150th anniversary. This tablet was to be blessed by the Rt. Rev. C. D. Jathana, Bishop, CSI-KCD and unveiled by Mr. Roshan Baig Minister of State, Government of Karnataka on the following day i.e (31.03.1989).

When we were about to fix the stone on the Western Façade (the outer wall of the choir room) we decided to place a Holy Bible, I.S.P.C.K Prayer Book and a Hymnal underneath the stone tablet. The Presbyter agreed to the suggestion. A polythene pouch containing the Bible, Prayer Book and the Hymnal was placed between the stone and the building wall and neatly plastered with fervent prayers and hopes to excavate the same during the 175th anniversary and preserve them as a souvenir.

The above was an 'Act of Remembrance' to mark the 150th year celebrations and we believed that our humble decision would keep alive the memories and sacrifices made by the men and women, who laboured for the growth of our church, which is 175 years old now. A few of them stand by my side as live witnesses even today to testify the jubilant historic event.

There was a year-long celebrations culminating in the dedication of our church office replacing the very old cycle shed which was used by our members for many years to park their cycles on Sundays.

This building was dedicated on 01.05. 1990 by Rev. J. R. Henry, Bishop's Commissary and opened by Mr. Oscar Fernandes, M.P and President, K.P.C.C(I) in presence of Rev. J.A.D. Selwyn, Diocesan Secretary and Rev. Solomon Gnanaraj, Civil Area Chairman. Our Presbyter was Rev. J. Saduri and the P.C Members were Mr. G.M. Dhanraj (Treasurer), Mr.V. Arputharaj, Mr. Edwin Joshua, Mr. A. Charles Wesley, Mr. J. David, Mr. Jacob Daniel, Mr. I.B. Prabhakar, Mr. Ravi Premkanth, Mr. Solomon Manoraj, Mr. J. Wilson, Mrs. Jem Deva Bala Victor and Mrs. Joyce Zachariah.

This building is a munificent gift by K.G. Hanumanthaiah a young philanthropist and a well wisher of our church families.

The stone tablet was donated by Mizpha Telugu Church (near East Railway Station) congregation.

The following priests served during the past quarter century (1990-2015). Rev. D. M. Bhaskaran, Rev. J. Saduri (two terms), Rev. D. Victor Thomas (two terms), Rev. D. Moses Jayakumar, Rev. J.A. Victor Joshua, Rev. A. Jeganathan.

Many of our church members have served as Pastorate Committee Members, Treasurers and Secretaries. The Anglican Worship in Tamil language continued. Many landmark projects were executed by the Priests and Pastorate Committees with the support and magnanimous contributions / offerings/ donations made by the members of the congregation.

How fast the days, months and years vanished! After 25 years, when the church was at the door steps of another remarkable milestone, an experienced and knowledgeable priest took charge of the affairs in our church on 01.05.2011.

On assuming charge as the Presbyter-in-Charge of our church, he observed that, there was an acute shortage of water in the church, parsonage and the parish hall. Therefore, the first project, he initiated was to dig a bore well, which was successful and now provides clean, sweet and plenty of water at all times for various purposes.

He also observed that our parish hall constructed in the year 1999 was in a dilapidated condition and he determined to renovate the same. His ceaseless efforts resulted in the construction of a well designed, spacious and a well ventilated parish hall, with a seating capacity of 400 people.

He is a tireless, sincere, honest and experienced priest, who devoutedly and meticulously engaged in planning for a successful and glorious celebration of the 175th anniversary of our church. He is none other than our respected and beloved Priest Rev. D. John Milton, a priest with a rich experience and service in more than 10 churches and the office of the Secretary in the Diocese for 4 years in the past and now.

We all know that our church conceived its roots from St. Mark's Church and therefore we cannot tideover the debt that we owe to our forefathers and Missionaries by whom our church was established and consecrated by the Rt. Rev. George Trevor Spencer D. D Lord Bishop of Madras on 31 March, 1840.

The time had drawn nearer and we realized that this was an opportunity for us to recognize and acknowledge and pay our tributes to the elders of the St. Mark's Church and the Missionaries who were instrumental in raising our church and hence, we resolved to draw a flame from the Altar of St. Mark's Cathedral to light up our Inaugural Candle.

On Sunday the 27 April, 2014, we brought the torch which was lit by the Rev. D. Moses Jayakumar, Presbyter-in-Charge, St. Mark's Cathedral and stalled it on our High Anglican Altar Table. It burned day and night for three consecutive days.

As the dust settled down with the sun rays glowing dim, the Septaquintaquinque Centennial Inaugural service commenced on 01.05.2014 with a majestical prelude. It was a magnificent sight to see the procession around the church with robes, banners, priests, bishop and the congregation.

And during the high eucharistical celebration, the Inaugural Candle was lit by our Guest of Honour Rt. Rev. Y. William, Bishop (Retired) Vellore Diocese from the flame drawn from St. Mark's Cathedral. The 6 other smaller candles attached to the Inaugural Candle were lit by the present priests who served in our church and in their absence, the lights were lit by the other invitees.

Rev. Dr. Vincent Rajkumar, Director, CISRS delivered a highly illuminating sermon on the "Apostle Saint Paul's Mission and the Church walking in his example". The memorable occasion ended with exchange of pleasantries by one and all assembled in the church.

A year long programmes like the Kathakalakshebam, Festivals, Special Services, etc filled the 12 months making the congregation feel the greatness of God and experience his love and mercy.

The Ministries (Sunday School, Women Fellowship and Youth Fellowship) were allotted a month each to showcase their talents and to glorify God.

The Choir, the Youth and the Sunday School won many prizes at various forums organized by the Diocese and area churches.

The Musicians accompanied the choir and played their musical instruments in a splendid manner.

Many developmental projects were carried out and executed especially the much awaited and anticipated Parish Hall, which was dedicated on 21.05.2015 and blessed by the Rt. Rev. P.K. Samuel, Bishop, CSI-KCD.

Due to the Lenten season, the 175th anniversary celebrations concluded with a solemn High Eucharistic service on 19.04.2015, instead on 31.03.2015. Bhagavadhar Dorairaj Vedanayagam Sastriyar delivered the sermon. The Bishop Rt. Rev. P.K. Samuel greeted the congregation and followed by the other priests and invitees present on the occasion.

A Postal Cover and 'My Stamp' were released to mark the 175th anniversary of our church.

A C.D with lyrics sung by Rev. Agilan and our Youth was released to commemorate this jubilant ceremony.

This was a day of happiness, contentment, peace and blessing to one and all.

A day to remember, a day to cherish and a day to thank the Invisble, Omnipresent, Omnipotent and loving God for leading us all these 175 years, especially during this Septaquintaquinque Centennial year.

Before concluding my report, I would like to thank all the priests with whom I had the opportunity to serve as the secretary for the last 25-30 years. They are a source of inspiration. I learnt a lot from them, because everyone was unique in themselves.

I thank all those who served the church from time to time as members of the pastorate committee, choir, musicians, organists and the members of the women, youth fellowship, sunday school, VBS staff and assistants whose contributions over these 25 years has greatly helped in the growth of the church.

A special thanks to all the members of our church for their generous contributions, offerings, donations and tithes especially over the last 12 months.

I take this opportunity to convey my very special thanks to Rev. D. John Milton, Presbyter-in-charge, whose plans, schemes, administrative capabilities got us through the Septaquintaquinque centennial celebrations.

I appreciate and thank him for his guidance, support and suggestions, which helped me in bringing forth the church history with the title "The Mission Church of Saint Paul" and the Secretary's Report.

I thank the following Pastorate Committee Members, who extended their co-operation and support during the biennium (2013-2015) Mr. John Christopher. M (Treasurer), Mrs. Anitha, Ms. Bhavya Rajeev, Mr. C. David, Mr. Enoch. J, Mr. Isaac Benhur Prabhakar, Mrs. Jana Richard, Mr. Solomon Manoraj.

Mr. Ravi was elected as Treasurer of our church on 29.06.2013 and performed his duties faithfully and honestly, ever toiling till his last breath (24.10.2014). A void, that cannot be filled so easily. I miss him a lot.

Thirdly, our Sextan Mr. Kariappa. He came from Chennapatna as very small boy during the ministerial years of Rev. G.J.R. Athistham. Hardworking, sincere and honest sextan till his departure from this world.

Lastly, I would like to remember and mention the names of Mr. V. Arputharaj, Mr. Jacob Daniel and Mrs. Joyce Zachariah, senior members, who rendered their services to the church as the members of the pastorate committee during the Sesquicentennial year celebrations.

My respects and prayers for the departed souls.

And finally, I thank the Father who has given me an opportunity to serve Him and His people in this 175 year old church.

I am very happy to know that all the persons baptized by me, are faring well in life, and all whose wedding I solemnized, are leading happy married lives.




I am extremely happy to send this message of greetings on the occasion of the 175th anniversary celebrations of my Mother's Church.

Another experience that will always remain in my memory is what happened in the year 1972 after one year of theological studies. As I was returning home for the term holidays I sent a letter to Rev A D John, the Commissary in the Diocese informing that I will be in Bangalore and will be happy to get involved in any ministry. He asked me to meet him immediately after my arrival. When I met him there was surprise waiting for me. He informed me that since the presbyter to St Paul's is yet to come and take charge and since there is no one to co ordinate the day to day programmes and the worship, that I should be at St Paul's to take all the worship and other arrangements till such time the new presbyter comes and takes charge. Getting some responsibility in my own church I considered as a blessing. In addition to this when the presbyter arranged for the following Sunday expressed his inability to come I had



to inform to Rev AD John to get permission to request other presbyters. When I informed him and suggested the names of other presbyters who could be requested, he asked me to conduct the service and preach. This was something that I never expected in my life after one year of theological studies. I tried to avoid by giving some reasons but he was firm in instructing me to conduct the service and preach. With the help of God I conducted the worship and preached the sermon. The passage on which I preached was Luke 7:11-17 Mother donot cry. The greatest delight was to see my mother sitting in the pew during that service and preaching. It was a moving experience for me.

In 1995 I came to the church as Presbyter Incharge which was a great blessing. I had a fruitful ministry but had to leave after two years because of a overseas proposal that the Moderator of CSI suggested for me. He recommended my name to serve in a parish in Dubai for three years. As I got relieved from the responsibilities and was preparing to leave the country, the news came from the Moderator that the proposal did not materialize. It was too late to change the transfer decision in the Diocese. I missed the wonderful chance of serving in my own church for a full time. I had seen the leadership given to the church by Pastors and lay leaders for more than 50 years. The church continues to grow and people who come here to worship on Sundays and other days of the week, particularly people of other faiths are greatly blessed. The famous government hospital by the side of the church caters to the physical needs of the people and the church cares for the spiritual and the physical needs of the hundreds of people.


I wish the anniversary celebrations a great success and pray that the leadership will strive to maintain the church and its traditions to be a source of blessing to many people.

Message

Dear Rev. John Milton

I am honoured by the invitation given to me to pen this message for the Souvenir to be released on the concluding part of the 175th anniversary celebration of St. Paul's Church. The Souvenir will be the sweet memory of the historic occasion of this church for the future generation.



I thank God for the opportunity given to me to serve Him and His people as the Presbyter-in-Charge of this church from 2003 to 2008. Though I came across certain unpleasant situations I enjoyed my ministry here and by God's grace I successfully completed my tenure of five years in this church.

According to history St. Paul's Church was the first Tamil Anglican church in the erstwhile Mysore state. The uniqueness of this church comprises its traditional Anglican order of Worship, the maintenance of the flowery alter decoration every Sunday (except Lenten season) the Holy Vestments of the Priest who conducts the Worship services. This attracts majority of the people to come to Worship God in this church from different parts of Bangalore without minding the distance.

I am happy to acknowledge that during my tenure of service, certain notable projects were carried out. The major projects are the renovations and raising of the compound wall from 3ft to 7 ft height to avoid nuisance from hooligans and inquisitive pedestrians. In addition to this the open area around the church covered with sand and marshy soil was concreted and dedicated on 11th July 2004.

The other major project was the renovation of the whole church building which was in a very bad condition. The whole church was repaired and replastered. The whole incandescent bulbs and old model chandeliers were replaced with new bright bulbs and attractive chandeliers. The old ceiling fans were replaced with new wall mounted oscillating fans. Today the interior of the church has a bright and festive look. The renovated church was dedicated on Whit Sunday the 27th of May 2007. Along with these projects, to overcome power failures during Worship Services and other programs a diesel generator set with 15 kv was installed. Though the bank balance was very little at that point of time, by the grace of God, and the generous contribution and donation of the congregation members, all these projects were executed to the fullest satisfaction of one and all. With the support and cooperation of the then Secretary, Treasurer, Steward and P.C members the above mentioned projects were completed successfully.

I thank God for the privilege given to me to become a member of this Church along with my family after my retirement. I also thank Rev. John Milton, the Presbyter-in-Charge for utilizing me in God's Service and for his kindness. On this joyous occasion I extend my hearty greetings to the whole St.Paul's family. May the 175th Anniversary celebration of the Church be an occasion for us to deepen our Christian commitment and strengthen our relationship with Christ to witness Him in this world.

DAD : Which Paul, your cousin Paul?


NATANIA: No Dad! St. Paul. He was just chatting with me.

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
